

Colonel Michael Glynn was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in Infantry through the University of Nevada, Reno Reserve Officer's Training Corps program in 1996. Colonel Glynn served as a Heavy Weapons Platoon Leader, Rifle Platoon Leader, and Mortar Platoon Leader with 3/327th Infantry Regiment, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault), at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, and as an Executive Officer for the Special Operations Preparation and Conditioning Course with 1st Special Warfare Training Group (Airborne) at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He joined the California Army National Guard in 2002 and served as a Brigade Assistant Operations Officer with 3/40th Infantry Division before transferring to the Nevada Army National Guard later that year. As a Nevada Guardsman, he served as a Squadron Personnel Officer, Squadron Assistant Operations Officer, Troop Commander, Civil-Military Operations Officer, and Squadron Commander with 1-221st Cavalry Regiment. He also served as the Battalion Executive Officer for the 991st Troop Command, State Mobilization/Readiness Officer, Chief of Training Division, Chief Financial Manager, and Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Training for the Nevada Army National Guard.

Colonel Glynn's military education includes the Infantry Officer Basic Course, Infantry Captain's Career Course, Combined Arms Services and Staff School, Command and General Staff Officer Course, and the U.S. Army War College. Colonel Glynn holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Spanish from the University of Nevada, Reno, and a Master of Strategic Studies degree from the U.S. Army War College. His awards and decorations include the Combat Infantryman Badge, Expert Infantryman Badge, Ranger Tab, Parachutist Badge, Air Assault Badge, Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (4th award), Army Commendation Medal (3rd award), Army Achievement Medal (5th award), and the Air Force Achievement Medal.
